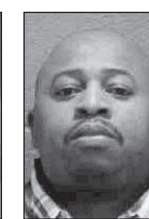

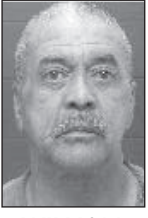

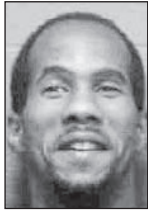

Man accused of assaulting stranger

DURHAM — A Durham man was arrested Saturday for allegedly punching a man to the ground in McDonald's the same day he was charged with multiple offenses related to an alleged assault on a woman.

Emmitt Clifton Sartor, 21, of the 400 block of Liberty Street as well as the 1000 block of Gaston Avenue, faces six charges and is held on \$550,000 bond. Sartor is charged with assault inflicting serious injury for allegedly punching another man — a complete stranger who was purchasing food with his family at a McDonald's. The impact of the blow to the victim's jaw chipped a tooth and dropped him to the floor, according to the arrest warrant.

Sartor is listed as having aliases of Sartor and Sarton. He also faces two assault charges and charges of common law robbery, first-degree kidnapping and interfering with emergency communication. The warrant states the victim was assaulted with a kitchen steak knife, struck repeatedly in the head and confined while being robbed of her phone, keys and wallet. Allegedly, phones were disassembled and lines removed, interfering

with calling the police.

Man faces two assault charges

DURHAM — Rodney Jones, 25, of the 600 block of Spruce Street, was arrested and charged Saturday on two counts of assault on a female. Jones allegedly hit the victim in the face and kicked, stomped on and dragged her. He was held without bond.

Three charged in weekend shooting

DURHAM — Two men and a teenage boy were arrested this weekend and each charged with two counts of assault with a deadly weapon. Edgar Cabrera, 19, of the 2300 block of Oriole Drive; a 16-year-old boy; and Allan Henriquez, 19, of the 2900 block of Chapel Hill Road, were each arrested and charged with shooting a 9mm handgun from a vehicle at two men on the street. No details were available Saturday about the location of the shooting. Each was held on \$28,000 bond.

Man accused of choking roommate

DURHAM — Ernesto Galindo-Tlalpa, 26, of Welch Place, was arrested Saturday and charged with assault by strangulation and communicating threats against a man living at the same ad-

dress. Galindo-Tlalpa allegedly choked the victim and threatened to kill him if he called the police. He was held on \$10,000 bond.

Man arrested in IHOP disturbance

DURHAM — A Durham man was arrested after allegedly creating a disturbance at the International House of Pancakes restaurant on North Pointe Drive early Sunday. Efrain Frankie Soto, 22, of the 2100 block of Elk River Drive, is charged with being intoxicated and disruptive and resisting a public officer. Soto allegedly cursed, shouted and rudely insulted others and refused to obey the officer's command to leave, then struggled during the arrest. He was held on \$1,000 bond.

Man charged with attempted rape

DURHAM — Elio Zuniga, 35, of the 1000 block of West Murray Avenue, was arrested Friday and charged with attempted first-degree rape, assault by strangulation and assault on a female for offenses that allegedly occurred on March 13. He was held without bond.

N.C. Presbyterians reject ordination of gay clergy

ELIZABETHTOWN — The governing body for eastern North Carolina Presbyterians has rejected a proposal that would allow the ordination of gay clergy.

The Fayetteville Observer reported the proposal was rejected by the Presby-

tery of Coastal Carolina with 63 percent of Saturday's vote.

The Presbyterian Church (USA) Book of Order requires clergy candidates either to be in a faithful marriage between a man and a woman or to be chaste. The proposal would have removed references to sexual orientation or

behavior and would have left the fitness of the clergy up to local presbyteries.

The final result for Presbyterian Church USA won't be known until all 173 presbyteries across the country vote. An official national vote count is due in May.
