THE BULL CITY HOT SHEET

The Herald-Sun, in conjunction with the Durham Police Department and the Durham Sheriff's Office, is featuring each Monday information on people who are wanted on outstanding warrants.

Listed are the individuals' names, date of birth and charges they are facing. The information was issued April 28.

The Police Department launched the Bull City Hot Sheet in February, and The Herald-Sun is running information on suspects each Monday from warrants issued in the past week.

on specific accounts but released a statement Friday asserting that the social networking site offers a "robust reporting infrastructure" for users to report instances of cyberbullying.

"We're concerned about any abusive behavior, and have made

these efforts to promote an environment where everyone on Facebook can connect and share comfortably," the statement read. "We encourage those who notice bullying to report it to us, and to discuss with parents, teachers and others in the community who can help."

According to a 2010 study by the Cyberbullying Research

Center, about 20 percent of students 11- to 18-year-olds have been the victims of on-line bullying.

Lugo said she believes parents need to step up to stop the behavior.

"A lot of parents don't want to say anything about it, because they think it's just online," she said. "But it's a big deal."

She also urged parents to keep a close watch on their children's social network-

ing activity.

"No child should have privacy until they're 18 — especially if they're living under my roof," she said. "When you give them too much privacy, that's when things happen."

Lugo said her son isn't concerned by the threats, but she said she still thinks it needs to stop.

"I told him yesterday, 'I know you're not really worried about it, but we can't just

let it go because it's a problem. If he does it to you, he can do it to other people," she said.

BATTLING CYBERBULLYING

- If someone threatens your child with violence, contact law enforcement immediately.
- Contact the Internet service provider of the harasser to ask that his or her account be suspended or blocked.
- Report abuse on social networking sites such as Facebook or Twitter.
- Save the original message to share with law enforcement. Officers may need more than a printed copy.
- Don't engage in any communications with a harasser. Keep a notes of the times and dates of incidents.
